

The aims and the structure of CNE

1. The primary objectives of CNE are:

- To defend and promote school students rights;
- To represent the school students as main beneficiars of their educational system;
- To involve pupils in the educational act, civical, social and cultural life;
- To defend all school students interests from Romania;
- To contribute to the development of democratic educational system in Romania, that promotes active citizenship in all forms.

2. CNE is a nationwide operating organization.

3. CNE is active in the primary and secondary education level.



Democratic and representative

structure of CNE

1.The most important decision-making body in CNE is the General Assembly.

2. School Students Councils function at different levels, coordinated by CNE.

- School Students Council (SSC/CSE) is the representative structure of the pupils, which functions in all the Romanian schools. It is composed of school classes leaders. The president is elected by all the pupils from the school.
- **County School Students Councils (CSSC/CJE)** is the representative structure of the pupils from all the schools found in a county. A County School Students Council is composed of the presidents of the School Students Councils, which represent the General Assembly. The president of the County School Students Council is elected by the General Assembly.
- **Regional School Students Council (RSSC/CRE)** is a structure composed of 4 to 7 County School Students Councils. The president, which becomes vice president of CNE is elected by the General Assembly, composed of the presidents and vice presidents of the School Students County Councils.
- The Romanian National School Students Council (RNSSC/CNE) is composed of 45 members, 42 of them being presidents of the County School Student Councils and 3 of them vice presidents of the Bucharest County School Students Council. The 45 members represent the General Assembly.

3.The leading board in CNE is composed of **11** members:

- -1 president (elected by the General Assembly of CNE)
- -8 vice presidents (presidents of the Regional School Students Councils)
- -2 Executive Secretaries (elected by the General Assembly of CNE)

4. The criteria for becoming a board member depends on the statute of the members of the Executive Board.

Vice presidents of CNE are elected by the General Assemblies of the Regional School Students Councils. The Candidates have to be presidents of CSSC.

The candidates for the executive secretary function need to be presidents of CSSC.

The candidates for the presidential function need to be presidents of CSSC and presidents of the Regional School Students Councils, depending on the region they belong to.

5. Members involved in School Students Councils are school students, only. Depending on the following levels the members are:

SSC(CSE): -school classes' leaders CSSC(CJE):- the presidents of the School Students Councils RSSC(CRE):-the presidents of the County School Students Councils RSSC(CNE):-the presidents and the vice presidents of the County Councils The Romanian National School Students Council(RNSSC/CNE):-the presidents of the County School Students Councils 6. There is not a membership fee for CNE's members.

7. A member of CNE needs to:

-be a school student

-be elected as a president of the CSSC


8. CNE is composed of 42 presidents of the County School Students Councils(CSSC) and 3 vice presidents of the Bucharest CSSC. The total number of members of right is 45.


9. CNE does not have any members of staff who are employed by or working for CNE. Each member involved in the structure is just a volunteer.

10. CNE is an independent organization. The General Assembly is the only organism which can decide, vote, adopt CNE's policies, projects, etc. Legally, CNE functions as a consultive structure of the Ministry of Education. Theoretically, the ministry is obligated to consult CNE for all school students issues. The ministry is also obligated to finance two General Assemblies of CNE per year according to CNE's statute.

11.CNE is not determined by any particular political ideology. Moreover, each candidate for any function in School Students Councils needs to sign a non-partizan declaration.

12. CNE is not a member of any other youth organization.


